- 28 consonants (You can self-study from my YouTube videos for the other 14 + 2 obsolete consonants or continue to my Vol. 2 course)
- 16 Simple vowels (The two other simple vowels will be taught in Vol. 2 course. There are only three diphthongs you will need to know together with two other vowel-consonant combinations.)
- Tone rules for three consonant classes

Vol. 2 course covers:

- The other 16 consonants (irregular + 2 obsolete ones)

- Transformation of vowel เ-า and the rest of the vowels (including diphthongs and obsolete vowels)
- Irregular spelling
- Two-syllabled words
- Usage of ะ (5 ways)
- Thai Pronouns + Wh-words (Question words)
- Miscellaneous + Exceptions (mismatched pronunciation and spelling, etc.)
- Introduction to **Modern Fonts**

If you'd like to build a strong foundation in Thai tones and pronunciation, I highly recommend taking the time to complete the first course.

For reading and writing, I suggest going through the full guide, which includes both Volume 1 and Volume 2.
